VIDEOS SHOWN THIS WEEK:

WATCH YOUR BACK by Ray Bayliss (6 min 4 sec.)

This video is set in a post apocalyptic era. We see a woman cooking a meal and suddenly she hears a noise in the basement. She is going down the stairs with a gun and a flashlight in her hands and carefully searches around for the noise.

THE END by Ben Leonetti (5 min. 45 sec.)

This video shows Ben's great imagination and creativity at work. We see an air balloon outside of town sitting in a field surrounded by forests. The video is shot in both negative and color format. The balloon is now in the air flying over the town below. Now with some color input, we are witness to a train flying down the tracks and visions of ground covered in fog.

We see scenes of soldiers, graveyards and shots of various areas and landmarks around Hamilton.

Ben now takes us cruising around Hamilton revealing to us different areas of the city and some of its artwork. The entire video is interspersed with different styles of music. Quite entertaining.

TROUBLE IN THE KITCHEN by Miro Kantarsky (5 min.)

(This was a special project for club members to participate in. Miro provided the basic idea of the video and other people were told to run with it.)

This video opens in a very nice restaurant where people are enjoying their meal.

One man starts complaining that the food he is taking too long to get to their table. The waiter takes the complaint to the chef in the kitchen. Meanwhile, the chef seems to be totally fed up with his job, drinking from a flask quite a bit. When the waiter tells him about the complaint, he grabs a knife and storms out of the kitchen to confront the man. As he walks by, he is scaring the other customers

and as he confronts the man, the customer backs down and leaves.

RESTAURANT 1 by Alex Szatmary (2 min 30 sec.)

This video was shot under the same premise as Miro's original video idea.

The customer has sent his food back as unsatisfactory. The chef comes out and threatens the male customer. The male customer, in fear for his life, gives the chef money to appease him and his girlfriend/wife leaves the restaurant in disgust.

SOYKA WITCH PROJECT by Barron Thompson (2 min 35 sec.)

John is mentoring a group of people who are doing a documentary at a church. People are working on their own projects wandering around getting ideas and doing "their thing". We see Jon walking around mingling with the group.

MIGHTY NIAGARA by The Toronto Video Club (8 min. 45 sec.)

This video was done in black and white and gave us a view of the earlier times of the Niagara Falls area. We saw pamphlets extolling the virtues of the exhibit. There is video of the hundreds of people boarding the Canada Steamship vessel to explore the Niagara River.

The passengers see villages as they pass along the river and they move on towards Queenston Heights to see the memorials.

People are now walking along picturesque trails down to the river's edge but then they realize that they have to walk back up the trails, steep as they are.

Now we see some of the travelers motoring along on the Radial Car, which travels along the Gorge on the American side only.

We watch the turbulent waters above the falls and see the falls from both the Canadian side and the American side. The original Maid of the Mist as it travels the waters.

THE THINKING CAP by Jon Soyka/HVFM 2008 (8 min 30 sec.)

Afterwards, we see them sitting around the table trying to think up ideas for future projects.
