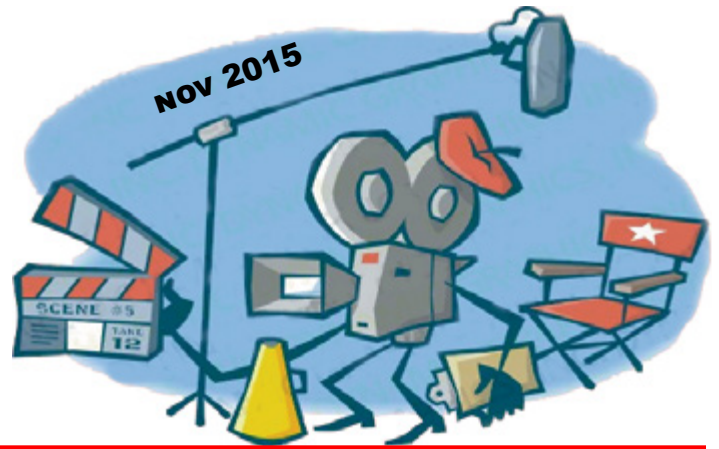

The smaller objects are carved out of wood,
covered in wax and then the beads are added.
Some arts and crafts include belts with beads
sewn on and other accessories. There is wall
art and life size animals like wolves, lizards
and big cats.

In the Land of the Hurons by Miro Kantarsky (6 min.)

Traveling by car, Miro takes his visiting nephew to many places throughout Ontario to show him the sights and sounds. He wants to show his nephew how wonderful Ontario is and why he is happy living here.

Among other sights, Miro shows him the Ste. Marie among the Hurons mission. They view the reenactment of the daily life of the missionaries, where they lived and the tall fences that protected them.

The indoor interpretative Sainte-Marie Museum provides an historical overview relating Sainte-Marie to 17th century mainstream life. It also serves as a fascinating and informative conclusion to your visit. The museum explains the motives and transportation of early explorers, the society and culture they left behind in Europe, what they came to in New France, and how they learned to adapt to a new way of life. Through the senses of sight, sound, touch, and even smell, the Sainte-Marie Museum illustrates the events of that era through more than 750 artifacts, which have been purchased, donated, or loaned.

After the coffee break, we were introduced the gentlemen from Henry's Camera Shop. They talked about the work being done with the new 4K equipment coming out.

The equipment provides better programming, and they work with small point of view cameras like the GoPro.

Peter mentioned different styles and prices for the cameras that he brought and gave a video presentation that showed excellent detail and great range of video options with these cameras. Everyone was impressed with the detail and clarity from what we saw.

They spoke about the drone market expanding to the private sector and how they improve the variety and quality of filming options.

Next the DJ 1 Phantom 3 Professional drone was presented and some video was shown on what the P3 can do and how it was created

The Sony FDR-AX33 4K UHD provides a balanced optical Steady Shot image. He talked about bridge cameras one of which is the Panasonic DMC-FZ1000. The Panasonic GH4 which is an ILC camera with Powerful video features

He also mentioned the Panasonic Lenses that comes in two types.

Next, We have the Sony A7s Mark II, which showed an excellent video full of great detail, even though the video was quite low light.

The Roto Light Neo presents very flexible light values and different effects.

We'd like to thank Peter and Joe for coming to the club and giving us a very informative talk about what is out there for interested video makers.
