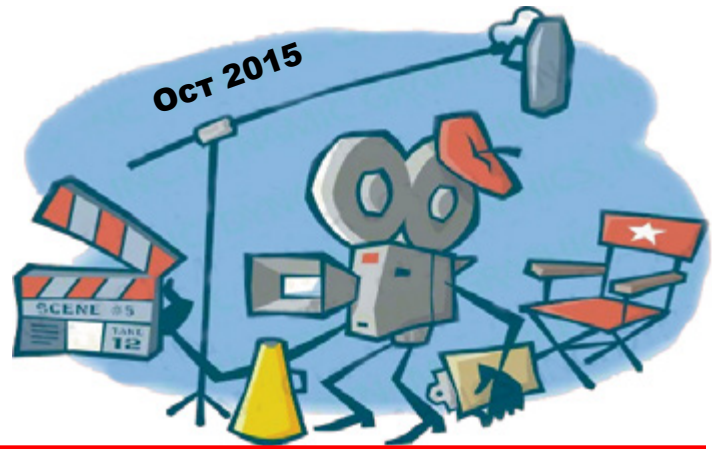

GENERAL MOVIES:

Hogar Panama by Ben Andrews (15 min.)

The video starts out with vehicles driving to Hogar from Panama City.

They are traveling to the Panama Christ Medical Mission. The travelers were greeted as they arrived, and were shown the plaques honoring the people who assisted in the establishing of the community.

The dormitories are set up separately - one for the boys and one for the girls. These children are ones who live at the dorms during the week as it is a long distance to travel to school, that may take hours to travel from their homes. From the dormitories, the school is two kilometers away.

The staff talks to the visitors about the need for supplies and food, and there was an open discussion with the teachers about how they felt working and teaching at the mission and the school.

We found out about the students and the daily chores that they do around the mission. After dinner, they do their homework in a communal area. The students are treated to a slideshow before bedtime.

The next morning, the visitors start their journey back to Panama City.

The video opens with a view of a very nice house in a well to do neighborhood. Inside, you see the mother, father and son sitting at the dining room table having dinner. Also in the room is a robot.
