

BAG NIGHT VIDEOS:

Alien Return by Group 1 (4:40 min) We see an wormhole opening up in the sky while a man watches from nearby. It drops something to the ground and then closes up.

In his excitement, the man tells the woman what he saw. He digs around in the ground and finds something small and orange. As they are talking, an alien beams in behind them unseen. They struggle with it and tie it up with a bungee cord. The woman tries to tell others but no one believes her.
