A bit of sad news to start off with. One of our (former) members George Gerula passed away this week. Not much details to pass on unfortunately. We will miss him.


Paul is still working on the HVFM website to make it mobile friendly as a lot of members & other people use their phones rather than a computer.

Based on actual phone calls to a 911 office in Tennessee. Some people complaining about everything from being chased by the police to a man forgetting he ate his sandwich.


A Trip To Venice (not the real title) by Ken Davy
