Evelyn Myrie, ACCA's president, has been at the helm of the association for eight years. She said that as part of the anniversary celebrations, the ACCA presented the Vince Hall Memorial Scholarship to Hamilton youth, David Okhimame.

The \$1,500 scholarship is named after one of the association's founding members, and recognizes a blend of community service and academic excellence.
